SOME ENERGY **SAVING TIPS**



- Switch off lights in empty rooms
- Close curtains when it gets dark, to keep the heat in
- Turn electrical appliances off when not in use do not leave them on standby
- Do not place furniture in front of radiators/heaters
- Set thermostats correctly room thermostats between 18-21°c (23°c if there are elderly or very young people in the property). Hot water thermostats at around 60-65°c
- Wait until you have a full load before using your washing machine and use a lower washing temperature (30° or 40° C)
- Only fill the kettle with as much water as you need
- Cook with lids on pans and match the size of the ring to the size of the saucepan
- Whenever possible, dry clothes outside for free; instead of using a tumble dryer
- Where possible use a shower instead of a bath

HOUSING ASSOCIATION HEATING TYPES







Below are the main heating types typically used by ALL 3 local Housing Associations:-

- 1. Gas Combi Boilers
- 2. **Electric Night Storage Heaters** Tariff should be Economy 7; the heaters receive a boost between **00.30 and 7.30****
- 3. **Solid Fuel Heating** (BHA/SBHA)
- 4. Panel Heaters Tariff should be Economy 10. The operating times for the more efficient Economy 10 tariff are between 04.30 and 07.30. Then 13.30 and 16.30 and finally 20.30 and 00.30**
- ** Use of heating outwith these times will be charged at your supplier's standard domestic rate.
- It is suggested that regular checks are made to ensure the meter clocks have been set correctly for the cheaper energy times.
- 5. **Open Coal Fires** still in operation in a few properties now. Over time, these should be replaced with more efficient heating.
- 6. **Electric Wet** (BHA/Waverley Housing)
- 7. Air Source Heat Pumps (BHA/SBHA)
- 8. Quantum Electric Storage Heaters (BHA/SBHA)

SHBA panel heaters are not on the Economy 10 Tariff

SOLAR (PV) PANELS





Solar panels work during daylight hours and more effectively during sunny periods. They positively utilise the power being generated during this time. There is no storage facility within the properties; so any electricity generated, but not used, will be lost.

The electricity generated may not be sufficient to cover the cost of certain things e.g. doing all of your washing or boiling your kettle. It acts like a dripping tap to reduce the overall cost of what is being used within the property.
